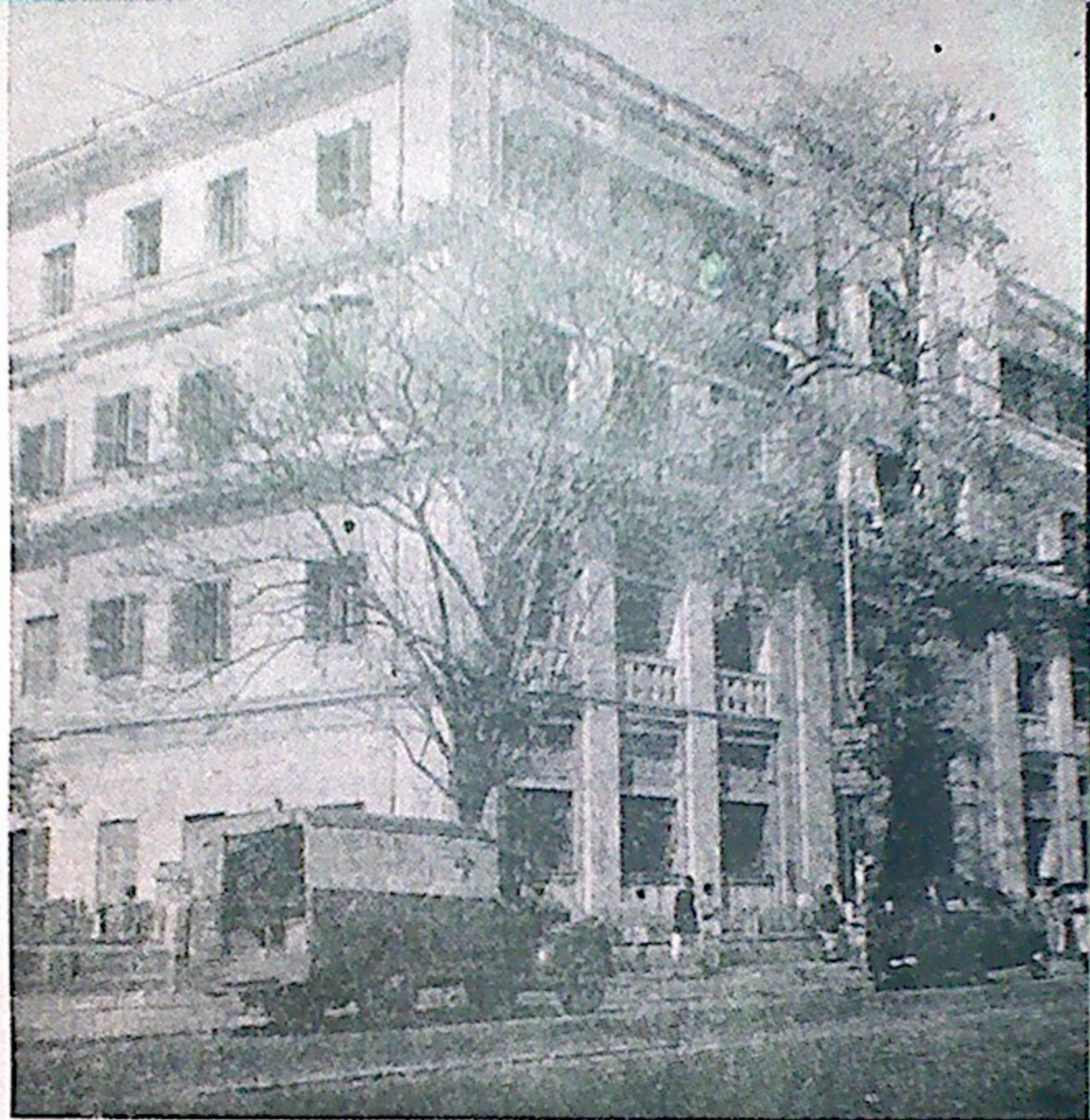

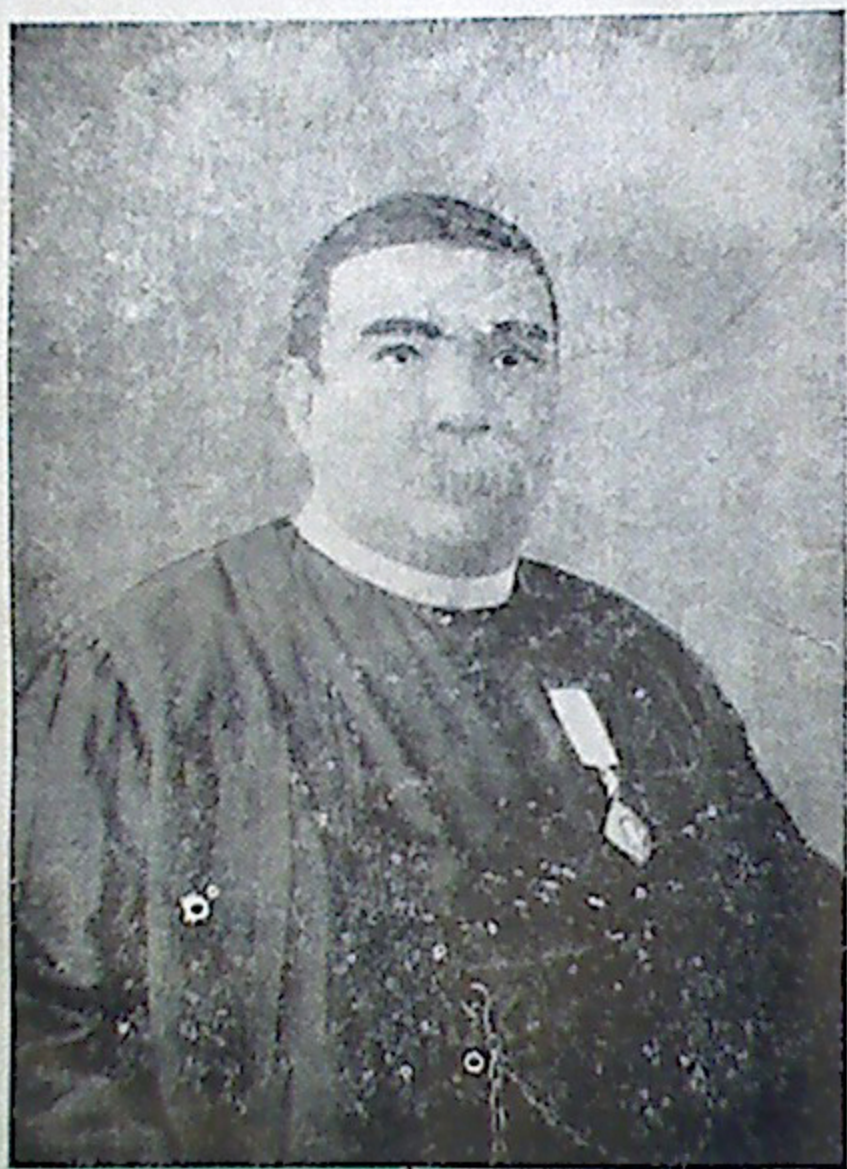

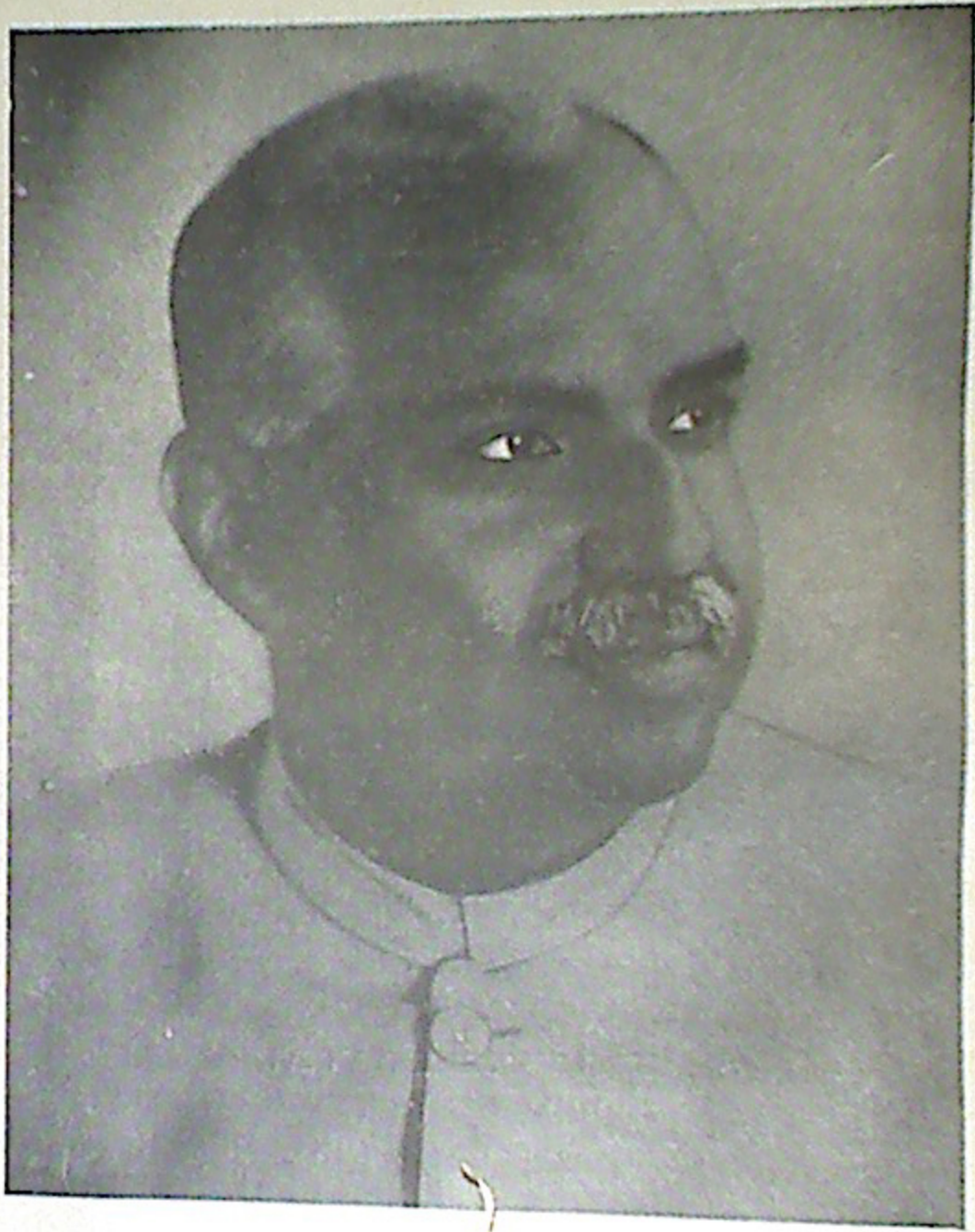

## SHORT HISTORY

Asutosh College steps into the sixtieth year of its glorious existence. Sixty years seem, as though, as many strides on our pilgrimage to the temple of learning. The period seems how long and yet how brief. Long, by the reckoning of ordinary mortals, and brief, considered in the context of the enormity of the task that it has beset itself. On this joyous occasion of the Diamond Jubilee of the College, a brief recounting of its history seems apposite, for it affords an opportunity as much for paying our homage to those but for whose selfless sacrifice the great heritage bequeathed to us would be impossible, as for renewing our pledges and deriving inspiration for their ultimate redemption.

The college is consecrated by the memories of two of the greatest sons of India, the Late Sir Asutosh Mookerjee and his worthy son the Late Dr. Syamaprosad Mookerjee whose life and work have been the perennial source of inspiration to all those associated with this great institution in the performance of the sacred duty of promoting higher education in Bengal. It is mainly with the help and co-operation of a selfless band of workers imbued with a spirit of dedication and missionary zeal that the College has grown from its quivering infancy to its present strapping youth.

The initiative for the foundation of the College was taken in February 15, 1915, by Sir Asutosh Mookerjee the greatest educationist in modern India. The closure of the Doveton College and the London Missionary Society's Institution, Bhowanipore in 1911 created a vacuum in the sphere of Collegiate education so far as the residents of South Calcutta were concerned. This made the demand for a properly equipped institution for collegiate education in this part of the city almost imperative. This basic object of the institution was set forth in the application for affiliation to the University dated 12th February, 1915.

"That such an institution is an absolute desideratum within this area must be apparent to all who are aware of the conditions prevailing here and of the difficulties, financial and otherwise, which the students of those places have to experience in having to prosecute their collegiate studies in the already over-crowded colleges in the town proper."

### INITIAL DIFFICULTIES

Unfortunately, however, the first opposition to the establishment of the College came from quarters from where it was least expected, viz., the Government of India. It was only in the last week of May 1916, that the Government could be prevailed upon to give final orders for affiliation upto the Intermediate Standard in English, Vernacular

Composition, Sanskrit, History, Logic, Mathematics and Botany. Necessary arrangements were made forthwith for the opening of the College in June following.

The First Governing Body of the College was constituted as follows :

At the First Meeting of the Governing Body, held on June 3, 1916, the Hon'ble Justice Sir Asutosh Mookerjee was elected President of the Governing Body, and Babu Dwarka Nath Chakravarti and Babu Provas Chunder Mitter were elected Vice-President and Secretary respectively. It was at this meeting that a resolution was passed—

“That the College be named the South Suburban College, Bhowanipore.”

By another resolution it was decided to locate it in premises No. 26, Lansdowne Road, which was to be taken on lease for a period of two years from June 1916, at a rental of Rs. 250/- per month plus the occupiers' share of taxes.

The last named gentleman having intimated his inability to accept the post of Professor of Botany, Babu Murari Mohan Roychaudhury, M.Sc. and Mr. N. Chakravarti, B.A. (Cal), B. Sc, (Ohs), were appointed Professors of that subject at the next meeting of the Governing Body.

Though it was originally intended to open the College on the 3rd July, 1916, the actual opening had to be deferred till the 17th July, 1916, from which date regular lectures to the first and second year classes commenced. There were altogether 288 students on the rolls during the first academic session—183 in the first year and 105 in the second year classes.

### REMOVAL TO BIJNI HOUSE

The success of the Institution in the very first year of its existence was so remarkable that the College had to be removed to the more spacious and more commodious premises at 157 Russa Road, known as the 'Bijni House' which occupied a central position with regard to the area the College was primarily intended to serve.

### CONVERSION TO FIRST GRADE COLLEGE

The experience gained in the very first year of the life of the College was so

encouraging and public enthusiasm so overwhelming that the provision for B.A. classes was considered an imperative necessity. Affiliation upto the B.A. Pass Standard was accordingly applied for in October, 1917, and this was sanctioned with effect from the commencement of the session 1918—19 in the following subjects :—English, Vernacular, Composition, Sanskrit, Mental and Moral Philosophy, History, Political Economy and Political Philosophy and Mathematics. Intermediate Science classes were later opened from 1922-23 and B.Sc. classes were started in 1925-26.

At present the College enjoys affiliation upto the Honours standard in almost all important and popular subjects such as English, Bengali, Sanskrit, Philosophy, Economics, Political Science, History, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Statistics, Geology, and Zoology. Today the College can justifiably plume itself on the unique distinction of being the only non-government College in the State which offers Honours teaching in such a wide variety of subjects. Its pioneering role in the field of Honours teaching in such subjects as Geography, Geology, and Statistics has earned it the recognition by the academic elite as the premier centre of collegiate education in West-Bengal.

### COLLEGE RENAMED ASUTOSH COLLEGE

In May, 1924, the College while still in its formative period, suffered an irreparable loss in the death of its Founder-President, Sir Asutosh Mookerjee, and as a mark of respect to its illustrious Founder, the Governing Body of the College at its meeting held on June 15, 1924 decided to name it as "ASUTOSH COLLEGE, BHOWANIPORE."

The Corporation of Calcutta very generously offered on lease a plot of land, measuring one bigha and fourteen cottahs to the North of the Hazra Park to facilitate the raising of a suitable Memorial to the Late Sir Asutosh Mookerjee. The magnificent buildings which now stand on this site accommodate Asutosh College and were constructed at a cost of Rs. 2,14,469/-. It is indeed a matter of great pleasure and satisfaction that the splendid buildings in which the College is housed at present had been raised upto the third storey entirely with the help of public donations and its own resources. The contribution of the College to the total construction cost being to the tune of Rs. 1,21,061/-. The College which continued its existence in the "Bijni House" for nearly two decades, was thus removed to its own building just opposite the old site. The fourth storey was constructed at a later date and the cost of this additional construction was borne entirely by the College. The new building contains ample accommodation for nearly 4000 students. It commands a beautiful view of the Hazra Park and has a mellowed dignity that entitles it to be reckoned among the notable edifices of this great metropolis.

### HOSTELS

At present the College maintains two hostels, one at 16, Basanta Bose Road and the other at 22, Kalighat Road. The former is housed in its own premises and accommodates forty-eight students and the latter is housed in rented premises and accommodates about

forty students. Admittedly, the accommodation available in the College hostels at present falls far short of the growing demand of the students.

### WOMEN'S DEPARTMENT

In view of the growing demand for adequate opportunities for collegiate education for women in South Calcutta, a separate section of College, meant exclusively for women was considered an absolute necessity. Accordingly, the Women's Department of Asutosh College was formally inaugurated in June, 1932 with 55 students on its rolls. Although the classes of the Women's Department are held in the morning, the girls can nevertheless avail themselves fully of all the facilities, academic and extra-academic, provided in the College. The Women's Department of Asutosh College was named after Srimati Jogamaya Devi, wife of Sir Asutosh Mukherjee in 1958. It is indeed a matter of great pleasure for us that Jogamaya Devi College, one of the three units of the Asutosh Group of Colleges, with its present roll-strength of 2200 is now reckoned as the biggest Women's College in the whole of Northern India and one of the biggest in Asia and has all the facilities for Honours teaching in all subjects as in Asutosh College excepting Statistics.

### EVENING DEPARTMENT

In response to a keen and insistent demand for classes in the evening, the College obtained an extension of affiliation upto the B.Com standard of the University from the session 1245-46 for the benefit of students who, while working in the daytime, might enjoy the benefits of higher education and thus improve their chances in life.

A further development consequent on the growth in the size of the College took place in the year 1948 when the Governing Body decided to reconstitute the Morning, Day and Evening Departments as separate and independent units, each under the charge of a separate administrative head with separate offices and accounts, subject of course to the overall control of the Governing Body. The College, however, continued to function as an integrated unit with a common staff council which included the members of the teaching staff of all the three departments.

In 1953 the College once again suffered an irreparable loss in the death of its President Dr. Syama Prasad Mookerjee, an outstanding national leader of our time. It is to his loving care and sympathetic guidance that the College owes much of its present eminence. As a mark of respect to the memory of this great son of India, the Evening Department of Asutosh College was renamed Syama Prasad College in 1958. The popularity of this College with the students will be evident from the fact that starting with 356 students in 1945 it has now 2100 students on its rolls. It now enjoys affiliation also for B.A. courses in some of the most important and popular subjects including B.Com Honours in Accountancy and Auditing, Secretarial Practice and Business Management and B.A Honours in English and Bengali.

## SEPARATION OF THE THREE UNITS

From the academic session 1958-59 the Morning and Evening Departments of Asutosh College acquired their separate and distinct identities and came to be known as Jogamaya Devi College and Syama Prasad College respectively. All the three Colleges—Asutosh, Jogamaya Devi and Syama Prasad—came to be recognised as independent units under the management of separate Governing Bodies with separate staff. But notwithstanding such separation, the fact of a common origin and common location provides an invisible bond of union which holds all of them together and together they constitute what is popularly known as the "Asutosh Group of Colleges"

## THE COLLEGE AT PRESENT

A brief history of the College given in the preceding paragraphs will give us a glimpse of the phenomenal development of Asutosh College from its humble beginning to its present magnificent size and form. Once established, the College has never looked back. In its history of expansion and development it has had the benefit of close association with two of the greatest personalities of India under whose loving care and direction the College passed through its teething period. This progress would not, however, have been possible but for the public support which it has been enjoying in abundance from its very inception. It indeed redounds to the credit of Asutosh College that this phenomenal development has been financed entirely out of its own resources. It is no mean achievement for the College to have developed to its present magnificent size depending solely on its own resources although for its maintenance it depends upon the financial assistance of the State Government which though not adequate has been regularly received. In 1952 the college purchased a plot of land measuring one bigha and eight cottahs approximately to the west of its present site out of its own reserve funds.

Following supersession of the Governing Bodies of all the three units of Asutosh Group of Colleges by the Calcutta University in December, 1973, an Adhoc Committee set up by the University Syndicate has been entrusted with the management of the College. It is a pleasure to note that six out of nine members of the Committee have long been intimately associated with the College as its teachers. The Committee has shown proper understanding and sympathy in the management of College affairs and it is hoped that the tempo of progress will be accelerated under its able leadership and guidance.

## THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

Each of the three Colleges has a well-equipped Library. The Library is under the charge of a trained staff, and students have facilities for using it till late in the evening. Each department has got a separate Seminar Library attached to it and it has been found immensely helpful by the Honours students for whose benefit it is primarily intended. The facilities of the Seminar Library supplement those provided by the General Library of the College. The present governing authorities of the College are alive to the

need for an expansion of the Library facilities to cope with the growing demand for books from the students, and the College has just completed a project for expansion with financial assistance from the U.G.C. and the State Government.

### THE SYAMA PRASAD GYMNASIUM

One of the most notable features of the College is its Gymnasium which stands on a plot of its own land to the north of the College Building. Named after Dr. Syamaprasad Mookerjee, the Gymnasium is under the charge of a capable physical instructor. It is one of the first of its kind in Calcutta and has won wide laurels in the sphere of physical culture.

### THE COLLEGE GROUND, MAIDAN

The achievements of the College have not however, been lop-sided. Its wonderful academic records have been more than matched by its unique records in the field of sports and games. Asutosh College has been traditionally known as the nursery of sporting talents who have brought laurels not only for the College but for the country in both national and international events. In recognition of its contribution to the growth of sports in the state, the college was allowed to have its own ground and tent in the Maidan in 1952. Since then it has been enjoying this privilege jointly with the Bangabasi College—incidentally the only two Colleges in Calcutta to enjoy the privilege.

### THE COLLEGE N.C.C

The College also has its well-organised N.C.C. unit under the charge of a number of commissioned officer-members of the teaching staff.

### THE COLLEGE N.S.S.

Asutosh College has two units of N.S.S. and Syama Prasad one under the National Social Service Scheme of the University, each of which is under the charge of an officer-in-charge who is a member of the staff.

### ST JOHN'S AMBULANCE DIVISION

There is an Ambulance Division known as the Asutosh College St John's Ambulance Division under the charge of one Divisional Superintendent who is also a member of the Staff.

### THE STUDENTS' UNION

The Students' Unions conduct the extra-curricular activities of the students with the advice and guidance of teachers. Among the different notable activities, publication of the College magazines, organisation of games and cultural meets, supervision of the canteen, of the College canteen and assistance to the Common Room deserve special mention.

## LOOKING AHEAD

It may be averred without any fear of contradiction that Asutosh College is at present one of the five big Colleges in West-Bengal and is rated as one of the very best in the state. The physical growth of the College over the past six decades has been more than matched by the qualitative improvement in the teaching of a wide variety of subjects at Honours level. The quantitative expansion of the College has at no time been allowed to dilute its qualitative excellence. Alongside its brilliant accademic record, its records of achievement in the field of sports and games will fill with pride the heart of every one true born Bengalee.

Encouraged by this record of success, the College looks forward confidently to a still more glorious future. The Adhoc committee set up by the University, is the present governing authority of the College. It includes some of the eminent educationist who have brought their enlightened outlook to bear upon the management of the College and shown their readiness to work in tandem with the teachers in bringing about an all round development of the College.

The great names which the College has had the proud privilege to bear is an eloquent testimony to its lofty ideal and an inspiration for unremitting endeavour to its ultimate fulfilment. Let us hope that the name of Sir Asutosh and Dr. Syama Prasad will bring in a whiff of intellectual fressness in this temple of learing and enliven the teachers and the students who live ronud it in their common pursuit of knowledge.

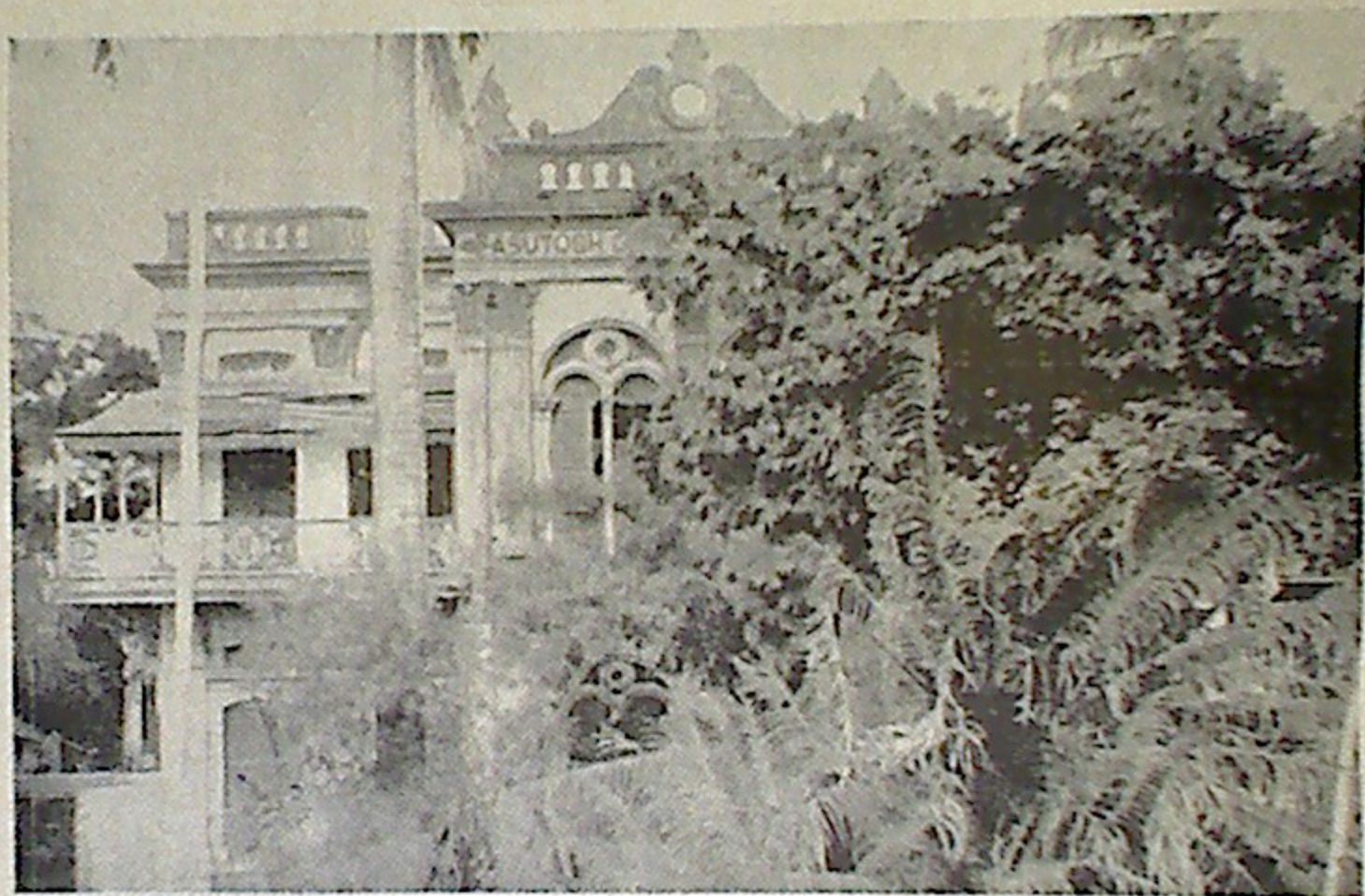
